Program Outcomes for 2015

In 2015 all of our referrals were from Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities (OOD) or one of their contract providers. We had a 7% increase over 2014 in the number of individuals served. We worked with twenty (20) consumers in the Job Development Program. This included one (1) individual who was in the program more than once.

The following outcomes for our Job Development/Placement Program are based on seven (7) consumers that found employment and maintained it for a minimum of thirty (30) days.

- The average wage was \$9.04 per hour. (Minimum wage was \$8.10 per hour.)
- 58% were able to maintain their jobs for ninety (90) days.
- The majority of consumers were looking for part-time employment and 100% of them found jobs working at least fifteen (15) hours per week. The average was over twenty-six (26) hours per week.
- 86% found a job within ninety (90) days of starting the job development program.
